If students are not taking an exam they will attend normal lessons and finish at the normal time.

A small number of students are attending the mock exams without equipment; emails have been sent home to help inform parents of this. Please can you support at home and ensure that your child has all of the basic equipment for exams and lessons every day.

The mock exam grades are also part of the evidence used by teachers to make predicted grades for applications to further education. Should your child miss a mock exam they will score a '0' for that paper and therefore they are more likely to get a lower grade overall. If it is in a subject where there is only one mock paper this will result in a U grade.
