Lost property

<u>Please ensure all items including bags have your child's name on it</u>. When a named item is found, it can easily and quickly be united with their possessions.

Unnamed items are held in lost property, located adjacent to our attendance office, and can be accessed by students at break and lunch time. **Parents/carers are not permitted to view lost property within school**. If your child loses an item they should check in lost property for 3 consecutive days. If the item is not found they should report the missing item to their pastoral team.

Individual students are responsible for their own property and below are some quick and easy reminders for you to share with your children:

- 1. Please ensure all items have your child's name clearly marked on them
- 2. Please do not bring unnecessary items into school, check their timetable to identify items required
- 3. When leaving a classroom or Clouds restaurant make sure they take all their belongings with them
- 4. When leaving the field or playground check that they have all their belongings with them

School dinners

Please ensure your child has sufficient funds in Arbor dinner money if they are accessing Clouds restaurant. If your child has been issued with a dinner ticket, due to not having sufficient funds on their account, these will now be showing as debts against your account. Please clear these costs as soon as possible; thank you for your support regarding this matter.



Free School Meal (FSM) credits will not show on Arbor dinner money but are visible to till staff in Clouds canteen. The amount of £3.03 will be available daily to spend, they do not accrue it if it is not used or the student is absent. Please check your eligibility here

Careers – All years

For students interested in a career in medicine - Years 10 -13

'Premed' Projects are hosting a few courses created by NHS doctors for students interested in careers in medicine. There are charges associated with some of the courses on offer. Please see their article below.

- 1) We're lucky to announce that on Saturday the 16th December we've been given permission again for students to enter the dissection room at a hospital in London (students must be aged 14-18) where they will be tutored in brain anatomy and biology using medically donated cadavers. A unique and very special work experience day for all students applying to medicine, students can see all the details available here. Students are already attending from all over the UK and Europe so we'd encourage interested students to confirm places on this one as soon as they can.
- 2) Our second course is an online day, Emergency Medicine Live on Saturday 18th November. You can expect to learn about the treatment and management of major trauma and medical emergencies. With insights into pre-hospital and emergency medicine. <u>Students can see more information here</u>.
- 3) Our third course is Surgery Work experience Live taking place on Saturday 9th December 2023. This interactive day is designed to give students a meaningful insight into careers in medicine and surgery. Students join a patient on their journey from initial presentation to diagnosis and treatment. The doctors will guide you through how they would conduct a surgical consultation, interpret signs and manage patients. <u>All the details available here.</u>
- 4) Our final upcoming course, completely free of charge is Medical Ethics Live, on Saturday the 13th January 2024 at 2.00pm. We've 500 free places on this course which will probably go pretty quickly, to attend the course, students just need to register here.
