Year 9 Diphtheria, Tetanus & Polio and Meningitis Vaccinations - Tuesday, 6th and Wednesday, 7th February This week Year 9 students would have been given a letter and consent form from the NHS for Diphtheria, Tetanus & Polio and Meningitis vaccinations at school. Usually the NHS would ask for online consent but they currently have a system issue, therefore they are asking that parents and carers complete the form and return this to school no later than Tuesday, 30th January 2024.

Please check with your child that they have the form and if you wish for your child to be vaccinated, please ensure the consent form is completed, signed and returned promptly.

Exam contingency day – Wednesday, 26th June 2024

Some of our families will be hoping to plan and book holidays for summer 2024, however, it is important to note that Wednesday, 26th June 2024 is a contingency day set by Ofqual. This means that all exam candidates must be available to sit exams from the date of their first exam until, and including Wednesday, 26th June 2024. This decision is not a school decision and does apply to all candidates, in all schools, we thank you for your understanding. Year 11 Passport to the Prom

This year's <u>'Passport to the Prom'</u> was launched last week. The annual initiative provides an incentive for our Year 11 students to attend as many revision sessions as they possibly can and encourage excellent school attendance in the final push towards their exams.

We realise that the Year 11 Prom is an exciting milestone in a student's transition from main school to sixth form and further education. It marks their journey towards adulthood, however, the Prom is not only a celebration of a student's time at Clacton County High School, but also a reward for the effort and hard work put into achieving their absolute best in their exams. Over the course of the next fifteen school weeks, up until the 25th May, in order to be eligible to purchase a ticket to their Prom, our Year 11 students will need to attend a minimum of five maths, five English and five science revision sessions, along with at least five other subject sessions of their choice. In addition, students need to achieve a 95% attendance record or higher through to their exams. As an additional incentive, students who complete thirty revision sessions or more, will be entered into a prize draw for some great prizes including; Prom Tickets, professional photos on Prom night and numerous other prizes.

CCHS staff are extremely dedicated; always willing to go the extra mile for their students, they provide after school revision sessions, additional support during holidays and even at weekends, closer to the exams. Students should contact their subject teachers to find out more details on the times and dates of any additional sessions, as well as consulting the <u>Year</u> <u>11 weekly revision timetable</u>, which is also available online within our <u>Revision Microsite</u>.
