Rewards (PROUD+)

Every day at school our students show us their maturity and act responsibly and we reward them with Proud + points. By recognising our students in this way, it teaches them the relationship between responsibilities, accountability, and rewards. Categories for earning Proud+ points include Perseverance, Responsibility, Unity, Opportunity, and Diversity.

In school we encourage taking personal responsibility to our students, this might be by bringing their equipment to school every day, taking responsibility for their personal property and looking after their items, following school rules - READY, RESPECTFUL, SAFE; or perhaps at home by completing independent learning, taking the dog for a walk or keeping their room tidy. Responsibility is a life skill; becoming a responsible citizen will stand our students in good stead for their futures. Exam Information Reminder:

All students need to attend in full school uniform, for the morning exams, we suggest that they are present at 8.45 am.

Essential exam equipment includes:

- Scientific calculator for maths, science, and geography papers
