for their part in hosting the ex-evacuees.

I was fully aware also of the

phone calls from those present at the reunion who were greatly impressed by their visit to the school of which you should be very proud, as such a conclusion could only come about when the leadership has been strong and dedicated over the period of which you have been in control.

I have in the past carried two pictures of Clackson County High School in my head, but after my visit to the new establishment the past and present images have merged into one which can only be an omen which holds good for the future.

I wish to thank everyone for brightening up and enriching the life of one old pupil.
