Day to Day Expectations

All students must feel safe, comfortable and confident enough to take responsibility for their learning.

Below are listed the day to day expectations for Clacton County High School students, this includes all times when representing the school in the community or on trips. These have been updated to include additional standards of behaviour as a result of the Coronavirus:

Student Expectations	
<p>At the start of the school day</p> <p>Students must:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Be dressed in full school uniform, including correct school shoes and any non-uniform items removed, including coats, scarves, hats and sweatshirts. ● Enter the school using their designated year group entrance. ● Wash hands using designated toilets/ stations on arrival to school. ● Not enter any other classroom other than the one outlined on their timetable unless with a member of staff. ● On PE/Dance days come to school wearing PE/Dance kit and their blazer. ● Switch off mobile phones and remove any headphones. These items must be placed out of sight for the duration of the school day. ● Make sure they have all the equipment and other materials needed for the day. At this time and due to the Coronavirus, students can no longer share or borrow equipment. ● Ensure they have completed all homework tasks set to the best of their ability and by the required deadline. 	<p>Between lessons</p> <p>Students must:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● If moving rooms, move directly to the next lesson and not use it as a time to meet friends; there is no excuse for lateness. ● Unless told otherwise, or accompanied by a member of staff, remain in their designated form base room until the start of the next lesson, behaving in a safe and sensible manner. ● Only go to the Clouds restaurant on their designated year group days.
<p>At the start of the lesson</p> <p>Students must:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Arrive at the classroom on time. ● Enter the room calmly and sit where the teacher directs. ● Get out all the equipment needed for the lesson. 	<p>Around the school</p> <p>Students must:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Ensure that they remain in their year group areas both indoors and out. ● Move quietly, safely and sensibly along corridors and around the site observing signs and directions from staff. ● Walk on the left in the corridors and stairways. ● Observe the physical distancing markers around school site, including when queuing to come into school. ● Take responsibility for keeping the school clean, safe and tidy. ● Think carefully about their actions, to avoid accidental damage or injury. ● Be courteous to others. ● Follow instructions given to them by all staff. ● Following break and lunchtime, remove non-uniform items when re-entering the school building, including coats, scarves, hats and sweatshirts. ● Not swear or use abusive language. ● Not have physical contact with other students in lessons, moving around school or during social times. ● Remember unacceptable behaviour towards others will not be tolerated.

During the lesson	In the community
<p>Students must:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Only enter and leave classrooms when authorised by a staff member. ● Adhere to the seating plan and remain in their allocated seats for the duration of the lesson, maintaining any physical distancing requirements. Staff may request for students to move when appropriate. ● Ensure that any masks or face-coverings do not display pictures, or any imagery that may be deemed offensive. ● Not share equipment, drink bottles or food. ● Use a tissue or elbow to cough or sneeze and use bins for tissue waste ('catch it, bin it, kill it') ● Inform staff immediately if they feel unwell or if someone in their household has any COVID-19 symptoms. ● Get involved and make the most of their learning. ● Follow the instructions given by staff. ● Treat the learning environment and everyone in it with respect. ● Complete the tasks to the best of their ability. ● Make sure they ask the teacher for help, if they are not sure what to do. 	<p>Students must:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Remember that whilst in uniform they are representing the school. ● Ensure that their actions do not bring the school into disrepute. ● Be courteous and polite to everyone in the community at all times. ● Protect the community and reduce the spread of the Coronavirus, where possible, by walking or cycling or travelling in a family car to and from school. ● If travelling on public transport, wear a mask or face-covering and physically distance as much as possible. ● Maintain physical distancing outside of school and avoid congregating in large groups of more than six.
At the end of the lesson	Cycling to school
<p>Students must:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Make sure they know what to do for homework. ● Clear away any rubbish and leave their area tidy. ● Reflect on what they have learned during the lesson. ● When dismissed, leave the lesson in an orderly manner. ● Move around the school in a safe and calm manner, following the appropriate directional signage and remain in designated areas. 	<p>Students must:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Ensure their bike is maintained in line with school expectations. ● Cycle in a sensible and safe manner at all times with an awareness and respect of pedestrians and other road users. ● Ensure bikes are secured in a designated place. ● Take responsibility to ensure their bikes are roadworthy and securely locked when left unattended.

This school does not accept disruptive or disrespectful behaviour; this school rewards good behaviour and values hard work and respect for others.
