Dear Parents and Carers,

**Information for Parents regarding COVID19 Contact Tracing
over the Christmas Holiday period**

I am writing to clarify the expectations around reporting cases of COVID19 and undertaking contact tracing over the Christmas holiday period.

As you know, schools have played a vital role in reducing the spread of COVID19 over the last 9 months. One way in which they have done this is by undertaking contact tracing on behalf of the Essex Contact Tracing team. They identify any individuals who have been in close contact at school with someone who has tested positive for COVID19, during the time that is considered the contagious period. This is from 2 days (48 hours) before the person's symptoms are displayed, or their test date (whichever is earlier). Those individuals are then required to self-isolate for 14 days because they are at risk of having contracted COVID19 and being contagious themselves.

This contact tracing will not be taking place in the usual way during the Christmas break when schools are closed and there is less chance of school-based contacts existing.

Please follow the guidance below if your child begins to show symptoms of COVID19 during the Christmas break.

If your child develops symptoms of COVID19 on Saturday 19th/Sunday 20th December (within 48 hours of being in school) or has no symptoms of COVID19 but tests positive within 48 hours of being in school.

If your child develops symptoms you must seek a test for your child and the household must isolate at home until the test result is returned. The quickest way to obtain a test is to book a test at your local testing centre via <https://www.gov.uk/get-coronavirus-test>. Please do not use postal tests unless absolutely necessary as these take longer.

If the test result is positive for COVID19 you must inform the school and we will identify if there are any other individuals within the school community who are impacted by this.

If the test result is negative, you do not need to take any further action.

It is also important to follow the guidance around accessing a test only when the individual is showing signs of COVID19. However, if your child is asymptomatic and returns a positive test result within 48 hours of last being in school, please let the school know straight away.

During this period, we have set up a new email address for reporting positive cases. Please email the school on covid@cchs.school providing the following information: full name of child, date symptoms started, date of test, date positive test returned (please also email the confirmation email/text from NHS) and your contact number during the holiday period.

If your child develops symptoms of COVID19 after Sunday 20th December (more than 48 hours of being in school) or has no symptoms of COVID19 but tests positive more than 48 hours of being in school.

- If a test result is positive for COVID-19, having developed symptoms more than 48 hours since being in school (from Monday 21st December onwards) you must contact NHS Test and Trace and follow the advice given by them: www.nhs.uk/conditions/coronavirus-covid-19/testing-and-tracing/
- You should only contact the school if your child will still be self-isolating for the first day of the new term which is Monday 4th January through the normal absence procedure.

Identified close contacts

If you are contacted by the school because your child is identified as a close contact of someone who has tested positive for COVID19, they must self-isolate for 10 days.

I would encourage you to adhere to social distancing and all COVID19 social mixing guidance for the remainder of term to reduce the risk of transmission of the virus as the last thing we want is anyone being unwell or required to self-isolate over the holiday period.
