### School PE Kit

I am writing to you on behalf of the PE Department regarding the standards of PE kit in school. Most students arrive fully prepared for their lessons ensuring they are in the correct frame of mind for a productive lesson. However, as a PE Department, we are growing increasingly concerned that some students are arriving to PE lessons wearing incorrect, or inappropriate, kit.

At Key Stage 3, we do not have the capacity to have every group activity inside and there are occasions where students must go out. Students are told in advance the activities that they will be covering for the full half term ahead, yet many are still not preparing themselves appropriately for their allocated activity.

On their PE/Dance days, students still need to wear the required PE/dance kit and trainers for the whole day with a blazer over the top, but when it is cold students may also add a base layer for extra warmth.

Below is a reminder of what kit students should have for certain activities:

Indoor	Outdoor
White polo shirt Blue shorts Blue school socks Trainers (rugby top or navy zip up sweatshirt if it is cold)	Rugby top or navy sweatshirt with CCHS logo White polo shirt Blue shorts or dark tracksuit bottoms. <b>NO leggings</b> Blue Socks Trainers (or if a field activity football boots are strongly advised)

Parents are also reminded that students should be bringing PE kit even if they are unable to participate. Students are encouraged to take part in the lesson in some capacity, whether it is coaching or officiating.
