CCHS Behaviour for Learning addendum during COVID 19 crisis (updated June 2020)

To facilitate a safe return for staff and students, an addendum to the Behaviour for Learning policy has been created to address any adjustments that have been made in response to the government's guidance on social distancing and hand washing. We encourage parents/carers to review this document before their child returns to school to ensure the social distancing measures are followed.

Outside of school

- Walk, cycle or travel in a family car where possible
- If you have to travel on public transport, wear a mask or face-covering and socially distance as much as possible
- Maintain social distancing outside of school and avoid congregating in large groups of more than 6

In lessons

- Students are not to enter any other classroom other than the one outlined on their timetable
- Students are to enter and leave classrooms only when authorised by a staff member.
- Wash hands using designated toilets on arrival to school and before leaving school
- Students are expected to adhere to the seating plan and must remain in their allocated seats for the duration of the morning, maintaining the required 2m social distance. Staff may request for students to move when deemed appropriate. e.g. support/call-in/call-out
- Any masks or face-coverings worn by students must not display pictures, or any imagery that may be deemed offensive
- Do not share equipment, drink bottles or food
- Use a tissue or elbow to cough or sneeze and use bins for tissue waste ('catch it, bin it, kill it')
- Inform staff immediately if you are experiencing COVID-19 symptoms or if someone in your household has symptoms

Movement around the building to toilets/lesson

- Students are required to move quietly, safely and sensibly as they move along corridors and around the site including observing signs and directions from staff
- Students will walk on the left in the corridors and stairways
- Students must observe the social distancing markers around school site, including when queuing to come into school
- Students that cycle to school must use the basketball court fence as a place to secure their bike

Students who fail to adhere to social distancing measures

As our school community adapts to social distancing measures put in place to keep us all safe, there will be moments when students forget to adhere to all the guidelines and transgressions are accidentally made. In such circumstances, students will be reminded of the guidelines. However, any student that deliberately or persistently fails to observe the requirements set out above, resulting in a heightened risk to the health and welfare of other members of the community, will not be allowed to remain on site. Persistent deliberate breaches of the new measures will result in the withdrawal of their invitation to attend face-to-face lessons.
