# **Duke of Edinburgh Practice Hike**

Our Year 9 DofE students endured some damp and cold conditions when they took part in their second practice hike last week, for their Duke of Edinburgh Bronze Award.



The hikers were split into small groups and used their navigation skills to find their way along their pre-planned routes using marked footpaths from the designated start and finish points at Little Bentley and Weeley Village.



The fifty students completed their hikes, without too many mistakes and are now preparing for their final practice hike in a few weeks around Gt Oakley, Ramsey and Dovercourt, before their 2-day assessment in Thetford Forest in June, which includes a night under canvas.

# 'Our Oceans' Art Project

During the spring term, four year 7 classes worked on a special art project entitled 'Our Oceans. As part of their studies, the students looked at the environmental changes that are occurring within coral reefs and the impact that climate change is having on these fragile eco-systems.



Students analysed the work of two influential environmental artists - Beatriz Chachamovits and Courtney Mattison, before observing images of coral reefs. Their research included looking at the journey of discarded plastic within our oceans and the existence of the Great Pacific Garbage patch. The students took inspiration from their research to then design and create their own ocean design and created various ceramic pieces.



Their ceramic creations are now on display in a special collaborative art installation, bringing together the work from the four classes. The exhibit endeavours to show the beauty of coral reefs, as well as highlighting the coral bleaching which is taking place due to environmental changes. Well done to all those involved.
