

# Sea Cadet's Experience in the English Channel

Year 8 student, Adam is a Sea Cadet with Clacton's Sea Cadet corps 'TS Atherstone', and immerses himself in every course and adventure that he participates in. He has recently returned from a week at sea, aboard one of the Sea Cadets' off-shore training fleet. Travelling from Poole in Dorset, Adam was one of twelve sea cadets aboard the motor launch - TS Jack Petchey bound for St Malo, on the Brittany coast in France. During the voyage the ship visited various Channel Islands whilst conducting countless training exercises in order for the cadets to attain numerous





dolphins decided to play in the bow-wake of the boat, as the ship left British waters, which Adam managed to catch on camera. As part of the week-long adventure, Adam was required to plan his journey to and from the south coast; he and another Clacton Sea Cadet, travelled alone by train from Clacton to Poole, having to navigate the London Underground as part of their journey. # A Hoard of Golds at the Coastal Athletics 2023

The annual athletics meet between the local schools took place this week at the Garrison athletics track in Colchester. The CCHS team had a fantastic day and managed to clock up fifty-eight medal positions - twenty-three of them gold. This impressive medal tally, along with strong performances across all the year group competitions, led CCHS to within just twelve points of clinching the Coastal Athletics Championship 2023. Unfortunately, we had to concede to the Colne Community School who won with 378 points to our 366; Tendring Technology College were third overall with 356 points.



The star of the day was Year 10 speed demon Tom with a tally of four golds; the first in the 100m sprint, followed by the 200m, when he sliced an impressive half-second off the school record. Tom then claimed gold in the triple jump and then as part of the Year 10 boys 4 x100m relay team. Other stars included Cabhan who won gold in the Year 10 shot and discus; as well as Imanu'El with gold in the Year 9 boys' high jump and silver in the 100m and discus. The year 10 boys team had an impressive afternoon on both the track and in the field events, clocking up a total of eight gold medals from the twelve events – In addition those already highlighted the boys also won gold in the 400m (Matt) and high jump (Tom). The Year 9 boys picked up



three of the teams' golds – Harry won the shot competition, Tamer gold in the triple jump and Imanu'El the high jump gold. These results combined to secure the trophy for the Year 9 and 10 boys.

The tally of CCHS gold medals also included Year 7 girls: Milly - Javelin; Year 7 boys: Jack - 100m, George - 200m, Freddie - Shot, Jake - Javelin, Charlie - High Jump; Year 8 girls: Emily - 100m, Eleanor - Shot and the team 4 x 100m Relay gold; Year 8 boys: Freddie – Javelin; Year 9 girls: Mia - 300m.

















Alongside our hoard of golds, there were numerous CCHS athletes who just missed out on a medal, despite producing some outstanding performances, all of these great results contributed to the final points tally and helped produce a very successful afternoon of quality athletics. In addition, we must mention the Year 8 boys' team, many of whom stepped in at the last minute, to enable us to field a competitor in every event. They produced some exceptional personal performances, and showed some outstanding resilience which epitomized our PROUD ideals! Well done 'Team CCHS', we are extremely proud of the determination of our athletes throughout the afternoon.
