# Year 12 focus on their Post 18 Pathways

Last weeks' Sigma Sixth Post 18 Focus Week proved to be greatly beneficial for our Year 12 students, with a range of events and activities to help with their future career planning. The various sessions, throughout the week, helped the students to focus on their choices for when they conclude their A-Level studies in a year's time. They looked at higher education, apprenticeship, employment and gap year opportunities, registering for UCAS (University and Colleges Admissions Service), preparing their personal statement and the job application process.









Students had an opportunity to chat with a number of ex-students ranging from those who had recently left, to some who had been out in the big wide world a while longer. They offered students their advice and spoke about their experiences since leaving school. Students also attended the annual UCAS Convention at the University of Essex, where higher education institutions from across the country gave information and advice on the courses available - over 40,000 different course combinations, at 150 institutions.

Throughout the week there was a particular focus on preparing for an interview by identifying their skills and personal qualities, as well as improving their communication skills, ahead of a mock interview. A number of industry professionals met with each Year 12 student, who had dressed as if they were attending a real interview.



Each professional participated in a special 'You're Hired' competition, selecting their 'best' candidate. Many of our interviewers struggled to come up with their own winner as the competition was extremely fierce - well done to Hadiyah, Holly, Linda, Tinotenda, Aidan, Julie, Dominic, Millie, Mollie, Mia, Olivia, Roman, Harry and Elliot. Linda Boxall was voted the overall winner with her interviewer, Mark Burrows from Breheny Groundwork Contractors, commenting on her performance - "Linda is clearly going places and was a pleasure to interview". All of the Year 12 students took on the 'You're Hired' interview challenge with bucket loads of enthusiasm - for us, they were all winners!

# Talented Artists Win Awards

The Tendring Show takes place at Lawford House Park on Saturday 8th July and each year the Tendring Hundred Farmers Club organise an art competition to design the front cover of the show's programme. The theme this year is "Creativity in the Countryside" and our Art team submitted numerous entries,



produced by our Year 7 and Year 8 students during one of their art classes or completed at home. This year, over thirty schools from across Tendring entered the competition with more than 2500 entries across both primary and secondary schools. All of our entries were amazing, and Tending Hundred Farmers thought so too, celebrating our student's entries with eight awards, including the top three prizes! Congratulations to Jasmine (Year 8) who won 1st prize and receives a £35 book token, family entry to the show and £150 for the school; her design will now take pride of place on the front cover of the Tendring Show programme 2023. In addition, Amelia (Year 7) won 2<sup>nd</sup> Prize, Imogen (Year 7) secured 3<sup>rd</sup> Prize and Millie (Year 8), was a runner-up. We also had Highly Commended awards for Brooke (Year 7), George (Year 7), Kian (Year 8), Bonnie (Year 8) and Heckter (Year 8). We are delighted that every student who submitted an entry wins a free entry ticket to this years' show. This has been a fabulous celebration of the art our students create. We have been overwhelmed with the number of prizes that we have won this year and the CCHS Art team are beyond PROUD.



# Spanish is Engaging

Year 8 students and their parents thoroughly enjoyed the special 'Spanish in Action' evening which commenced with a lesson on how to order food and drinks in a Spanish restaurant.

The annual 'Inclusion Day' took place earlier this week, when over two-hundred and fifty Multi-School Councillors, from across Essex, converged on Braxted Hall, near Witham. The special fun day, to help celebrate inclusion and diversity, was organised by the Essex SEND Strategy and Innovation team, along with



numerous agencies who helped ensure that everyone had an enjoyable and inclusive day. Our councillors joined students from thirty-seven other primary, secondary and special schools with one goal in mind - to celebrate that everyone is different with their own, individual need. This could be just general support, someone to talk to, a group where they can feel accepted, a hobby they can concentrate on, or something they can do to lift their state of mind. Spread over three activity zones the students spent the day designing, making, playing and enjoying the wide variety of activities that children of all ages and abilities could participate in together. They even had the opportunity to work with some very special therapy dogs!











The Essex Multi-school Council aims to help break down perceptions towards children with SEND and mental health difficulties in schools and their wider communities. Children from mainstream and special schools meet regularly throughout the year to learn more about each other and put their plans in place for making a difference. Not only does the council help break down perceptions, it provides young people with an opportunity to improve their confidence, to develop their personal and social skills and to promote important values like democracy and acceptance. Throughout the day, Multi-school Council Ambassadors and a Paralympian spoke about their own journeys to help inspire and help build confidence. An enjoyable action-packed and fun day was had by all!
