Before half-term, we featured our netball teams and this week it is the turn of football to be in the news! The Coastal Schools football season concluded this week with the final Year 10 fixture played against Tendring Technology College.

Our Year 10 footballers finish the season as league champions, after a nail-biting match against Tendring this week with CCHS scraping a 4-3 win to clinch the top spot. They had a great season with other victories against Harwich, Clacton Coastal, Manningtree and draw against the Colne. Congratulations to the team and their coach, Head of Year 10, Mr Devaux. Our Year 8 team have had another fantastic season having won the league last year, winning three of their five fixtures - 4-1 against Tendring, 2-0 against Harwich and a decisive win against Clacton Coastal; they drew 1-1 at Colne after an evenly matched game and only lost to Manningtree. They finish their season as league runners-up to Manningtree – another great achievement for the whole squad and their manager, Mr Debenham.

The Year 7 squad have had mixed results in their first season playing together winning 5-2 against Clacton Coastal and 1-0 against Manningtree but were defeated by Tendring, Colne and Harwich. The Year 9 squad finished mid-table with two wins and two defeats, they triumphed 4-1 against Tendring and 2-1 in a close match against Harwich with defeats to Manningtree and Colne. Our Year 11 team have had an exciting but short season - they drew their match against Manningtree, with defeats against Tendring and Harwich. Well done to all of our footballers for a great display of determination throughout the season. We now look forward to the boys' rugby and the girls' football competitions when they commence after February half-term when the evening daylight begins to lengthen.

## District Cross-Country Championships 2024 – Year 7 Girls Team Champions!

Last week, our CCHS Cross-Country team travelled to the Colchester Northern Gateway sports ground for this year's annual District Cross-Country Championships. The conditions were perfect for cross-country running with a lovely sunny day, light winds and relatively firm ground due to a lack of rain recently.

In their first competitive cross-country race, the Year 7 girls and boys excelled themselves. The Year 7 girls' team (picture right) had a fantastic day with their four runners all finishing in a combined score of 65 points making them the overall champions. This is the first time in recent years that CCHS has had a winning cross-country team. Holly was placed 7<sup>th</sup> - one of our best individual results of the day, Darcey 11<sup>th</sup>, Savannah 17<sup>th</sup> and Ruby in 30<sup>th</sup> - an outstanding team effort. In the Year 7 boys' race, Henri finished 44<sup>th</sup>, Harley 48<sup>th</sup>, followed by Harry 57<sup>th</sup>, Oscar 60<sup>th</sup> and Riley 61<sup>st</sup> - the Year 7 boys' team were placed 13<sup>th</sup> overall. In the Under 14 (Year 8 & 9) events, our boys finished with Michael in 38<sup>th</sup>, Bailey in 41<sup>st</sup>, followed by Jacob 74<sup>th</sup> and Henry 75<sup>th</sup>. Their combined results (top 4 finishers) put the Under 14 boys' team in 15<sup>th</sup> overall, with the girls also finishing in a credible 15<sup>th</sup> position with Imogen placing 11<sup>th</sup>, Mia 47<sup>th</sup>, and Grace in 84<sup>th</sup> position.



In the Under 16 (Year 10 & 11) events our boys' team were placed in 8<sup>th</sup> position overall and with Flynn finishing in 5<sup>th</sup> position, producing our best individual performance of the day and four places better than last year. He was followed home by Seth 20<sup>th</sup>, Teddy 49<sup>th</sup> and Henry 56<sup>th</sup>; the Under 16 girls' team consisted of just two runners – Ruby finishing in 22<sup>nd</sup> and Princess in 27<sup>th</sup>. Flynn's result, along with Holly in Year 7, now entitles them to be part of the selection process to represent the Colchester District at the Essex Cross-Country Championships. Well done to all our CCHS team runners, we are very proud of your representation of the school and for an outstanding effort and determination.
