## ***Duke of Edinburgh Bronze – New Cohort complete their Inaugural Hike.***

Our Broader Curriculum provides Year 9 students with the opportunity to learn some real life and alternative skills, which sit alongside their academic learning. Our new cohort of Duke of Edinburgh students recently embarked on their first practice hike departing from either the West Clacton Martello Tower or the Tendring Education Centre, the home of the CCHS sixth form, Sigma Sixth, the students walked over 8 miles via St Osyth and Lee-Over-Sands, crossing in the middle.



The sixty-plus students had spent a number of weeks, planning their route and learning how to navigate using a map, before embarking on their 4-hour trek across the fields, footpaths and sea wall. Despite the early morning snow, the clouds cleared and the sun appeared and it warmed-up significantly before the groups set off. The conditions underfoot still made the going tough in places, including rather a lot of mud across the marshland behind the sea wall.



The new route, for the first practice walk for this year's Duke of Edinburgh students, proved rather tricky for some groups when they misinterpreted their maps and missed the footpaths they were looking for and had to make a detour to get back on track. The new route was longer than in previous years which meant a number of groups, who had made a few errors, ran out of time to complete the full distance, although a number of groups did exceptionally well to finish in the allotted time. They are now busy planning their next practice expeditions that will take place next spring; one around Weeley & Tendring and the other around Ramsey, Gt Oakley & Harwich, ahead of their assessment hike in Thetford Forest next summer. Well done to them all!
