Science - Learning on Location @ Minsmere Nature Reserve

Over the past couple weeks, over fifty Year 10 Science students have attended one of the two science trips to the RSPB Nature Reserve at Minsmere, on the Suffolk coast. They utilised their day 'Learning on Location' to focus on different sampling techniques, as part of their GCSE Biology course. Unfortunately, the first trip was a little wetter than the second!



The RSPB Education team delivered a day of practical activities with students learning about how to conduct random sampling. They used the data they collected to map the composition of invertebrates in a part of the nature reserve. Students also undertook the systematic sampling of plants, to assess the impact of visitors on the biodiversity of plants within part of the nature reserve.



Year 7 Mathematicians in Action

A number of our top Year 7 mathematicians recently travelled to St Helena School in Colchester for their first North Essex Maths Olympiad (NEMO); the final edition of this year's annual contest for Year 7, 8 and 9 students. Over eighty students,

from nine schools from across North Essex battled it out and as always, there was an extremely high level of mathematics on display resulting in a very good competition; some of their adversaries are already working at a level of maths expected from Year 9 students! Well done to both CCHS teams who showed excellent cooperation and high spirits throughout, and impressed the judges! Our two teams showed excellent teamwork and work ethic throughout the competition, coming very close to completing the dreaded NEMO Challenge. CCHS Hosts Annual Sigma Trust STEM day

This week a team of Year 8 students competed in the annual Faraday Challenge day led by the Institute of Engineering and Technology (IET) and hosted at CCHS. Teams from the other Sigma Trust secondary schools competed against each other in the national competition entered by hundreds of other schools. The engineering-based competition is now in its 16th year and for the 2023/24 Faraday Challenge, the IET have teamed up with National Highways and The Rees Jeffreys Road Fund. Teams of six students from across the country are competing to see who can design and create a device linked to their brief- as teams are competing throughout the year, details about the challenge need to remain secret so not to give other teams an unfair advantage! During the Challenge Day, the teams worked on their designs producing their own design brief and an explanation of their ideas, along with the construction of a working prototype model.



Without disclosing any of the challenge details, the CCHS team designed an electric car charging station that was powered by solar panels. The day concluded with a presentation by each team, judged by the Faraday Trust co-ordinator who led the day. Well done to Tinashe, Rebecca, Zac, Zack, Lola and Lillie - despite not having the winning project, the whole team were a credit to the school and contributed together extremely well.

Pass it Forward – Former Student returns to lead Sixth Form Art Workshop

Recently, our Year 12 A-Level Art students welcomed the opportunity to work with local artist Annie Ashwell, whose appetite for art was ignited whilst she was a student at CCHS, and refined through her GCSE and A-level Art portfolios. Annie took time throughout the workshop to impart her knowledge and experiences in relation to creating a portfolio for university art applications and how to exhibit and promote your artwork to establish a career as a practising artist. The students thoroughly enjoyed the creative process of the workshop and were inspired by Annie's passion and enthusiasm for Art.



Opening Eyes on Modern Foreign Languages

This week, a number of our Year 10 GCSE Spanish students enjoyed a day at the University of Essex, as guests of the Languages Faculty. They were introduced to a number of Under-Graduate and Masters Language students, who spoke about studying languages at University, their experiences of their year living abroad to help immerse themselves in the language they are studying and the exciting opportunities that being bi-lingual can offer. The day included a special insight into the world of translation, in particular dubbing and subtitling of various forms of media, both in native and second languages. It was fascinating to learn that it is not just a case of translating the audio into another language but the necessary consideration to the dubbed vocal fitting with the mouth movements of the actors and the length of the subtitles compared to the time it takes to read verses the duration of the particular scene. The students also had an opportunity to learn about the various study opportunities offered by the University of Essex, in any subject, not only languages. The day concluded with a tour of the vast campus including an insight into the amount of on-campus accommodation available to all Essex University students.
