A number of CCHS staff braved being drenched in ice cold water recently, all in aid of helping raise much needed funds for a little-known research charity - Histiocytosis UK. Eighteen months ago, the son of CCHS teacher, Mrs Mills, sadly passed away from an extremely rare histiocytic disorder. These illnesses are characterised by increased numbers of white blood cells called histiocytes in the blood and tissues. In all forms of histiocytosis, these cells, which are part of the protective immune system, begin to attack the body, targeting many organs of the body.



In partnership with our Year 9 Broader Curriculum Charities group and the help of the Humanities department, Mrs Mills organised the special event, which was a fantastic conclusion to the first half of the summer term and helped raise over £250 in the process. Students purchased raffle tickets with the opportunity, for those with the winning numbers drawn out at random, to pour an ice-cold bucket of water over one of the twenty-four staff volunteers. Many thanks to the teachers who agreed to be drenched and to Mrs Mills and her team for organising the event.
