To bring their learning to life, over 120 of our students recently enjoyed two action-packed "learning on location" days at Colchester Castle. These visits were an invaluable opportunity for them to consolidate their classroom knowledge by experiencing the castle's history first hand.

Recognising Individuals – Jack Petchey 'Outstanding Achievement' Awards






Tendring District Council, Councillor Mark Stephenson, who congratulated them on their magnificent achievements.



This week marked a significant historical moment for Clacton with the unveiling of its very first 'Blue Plaque'. The plaque celebrates the remarkable life of Catherine Booth, widely known as the "Mother of the Salvation Army." She lived and passed away in a house that once stood on the site now occupied by the Crossley View Retirement Apartments on Clacton seafront.

The national blue plaque scheme recognizes historic individuals who have made

significant contributions to human welfare or happiness. Student representatives were honoured to attend the ceremony, which was graced by the presence of His Majesty's Lord Lieutenant of Essex, Mrs. Jennifer Tolhurst.

Catherine Booth was one of Victorian Britain's most influential social reformers and co-founder of the Salvation Army, alongside her husband General William Booth. As part of the poignant ceremony, students Jess and Karina presented flowers to Sister Philomena of the St. Michael's Convent and Care Home, who graciously hosted a portion of the event.

District Athletics 2025



Our top athletes recently represented CCHS at the annual District Athletics meet, competing against schools from across Colchester and North East Essex. A fantastic day of competition resulted in numerous outstanding performances and personal achievements for our thirty competitors. The team had numerous personal best performances with two CCHS athletes winning gold and others having to settle with silver or bronze. The first gold came with Jayden C. winning the Year 9 Boy's 200m; he later took the Bronze in the 100m finals. The second CCHS gold came from Ruben with a fantastic result in the Year 9 boy's discus.



The CCHS team also picked up silver medals from Holly in the Year 7 girl's 1500m, Tyler in the Year 7 boy's discus and Sydnie in the Year 10 girl's High Jump; Sydnie also won bronze in her Triple Jump event. There were also bronze medals for brothers Jacob and Jayden in the Year 8 and Year 9 boy's 300m respectively; Daisy in the Year 10 girl's 200m and the Year 7 girls' team, who rounded off the day with a stunning race in the 4 x 100m relay. The governors, staff, and students at CCHS would like to say a big thank you for the hard work of all the staff leaving CCHS this year, and to wish them every success and good luck in the future.







After months of rehearsals, set building, and costume production, the 2025 school musical Oliver! took to the stage, delivering four outstanding sell-out performances. The tireless efforts of our performing arts team resulted in one of the finest shows yet, reflecting the true dedication and passion of everyone involved. The cast's enthusiasm, talent, and commitment radiated through every scene, breathing life into this much-loved classic. The ensemble performed with heart and precision, bringing their characters to vivid reality and creating a sense of magic that captivated audiences from start to finish.







Standout performances included Joss Miller's (Year 13) fresh and exciting portrayal of Fagin, earning him standing ovations for his solo number. Violet Palmer's (Year 7) breath-taking vocals as Oliver left the audience spellbound, while Seth Garner's (Year 11) Artful Dodger brought charm and youthful exuberance to the role. The CCHS production was again blessed with rave reviews including one from local actor and film director, AG Longhurst, who had never attended one of our musicals before and was blown away with the quality of the whole production; the outstanding performances from the whole ensemble and especially the lead characters.



From start to finish, Oliver! was a triumph of storytelling, music, and movement. The songs were delivered with confidence and finesse, while the choreography filled the stage with energy and dynamic precision. Every moment was crafted with care, and the acting captured the heart and soul of Dickens' tale.
