Whole School Notices

Punctuality - Week commencing Monday, 20th January

From Monday, 20th January there will be changes for students arriving late to school. We ask all our CCHS families to refer to the CCHS punctuality <u>statement</u> highlighting the importance of good punctuality and discuss this at home with your child/ren.

School entrance gates

Both the Leisure centre entrance and front entrance (Walton Road) open at 08.15 am and close at 08.50 am

Registration 08:45 am

All students are expected to be in registration by 08:45 am ready to start the day in full school uniform

Changes

Arriving late - between 08:50 am and 09:15 am

Students arriving at school late between 08.50 am and 09.15 am need to report to a member of staff at the front entrance (green gate) – they are not permitted to go to reception. The staff member will gather details and then dismiss them either to Form or Period 1, depending on the time. These students will receive a Pastoral After School Catch-up on the same day, $3.15 \, \text{pm} - 3.30 \, \text{pm}$.

Arriving late – after 09.15 am

Students report to the reception and will be escorted to the Attendance Office to sign in. These students will receive a senior detention to complete on the same day, 1.15 pm – 1.45 pm.

Authorised lateness/absence

If there is a justifiable reason for lateness, authorised by the school, the consequence (after-school catch-ups/senior detentions) will be cancelled and the lateness will be marked as authorised, this is the school's decision to make. Parents/carers should contact the attendance office to report lateness or absence on 01255 424266 (ext.1) or via email at absence@cchs.school on the same morning or in advance. We hope that all our CCHS families will support us by communicating with the children the importance of good punctuality and attending school on time.

Are you a Military Service Family?

The Department for Education (DfE) introduced the Service Pupil Premium (SPP) in April 2011 in recognition of the specific challenges children from service families face and as part of the commitment to delivering the armed forces covenant.

State schools, academies and free schools in England, which have children of service families in school years reception to year 11, can receive the SPP funding. It is designed to assist the school in providing the additional support that these children may need.

Therefore, if your child is eligible, please can you confirm your service status by contacting us on 01255 424266 or emailing admin@cchs.school

'Pupils are eligible for SPP if they meet one of the following criteria:

- One of their parents is serving in the regular armed forces (including pupils with a parent who is on full commitment as part of the full-time reserve service)
- They have been registered as a 'service child' on a school census in the past 6 years (see below the 'DfE's ever 6 service child measure')
- One of their parents died while serving in the armed forces and the pupil receives a pension under the Armed Forces Compensation Scheme or the War Pensions Scheme
- One of their parents is in the armed forces of another nation and is stationed in England'

We also have the Ever 6 measure for service children so any Ex-service personnel that left the service within the last 6 years should also let us know as they will also be eligible for the extra funding.

What the DfE website says about the Ever 6 measure:

'The premium was extended so that any pupil in reception to Year 11 who has been flagged as a service child in the last 6 years will continue to receive the premium.

Ex-service personnel should tell the school if they left the armed forces within the last 6 years. Under the DfE's 'ever' measure, schools will continue to receive SPP for up to 6 years for children whose parent(s) left the armed forces, provided the children were recorded as service children in a school census prior to their parent(s) leaving the forces. The ever measure also applies when service parents divorce or separate or when a service parent dies in service.'


