#### **Whole School Notices**

#### Keeping dinner money accounts topped up

At CCHS we have a cashless system in operation in our canteen - Clouds. Students can access food and drink at break and lunchtime and pay for items using funds either uploaded on to Arbor pay by parents and carers and/or free school meal allowances. Packed lunches and snacks from home are welcome at CCHS (*please avoid foods containing nuts.*) Please make sure you top up your child's Arbor dinner account in advance if you wish them to access refreshments at school in addition to FSM allowances or otherwise.

**Dinner tickets** are not available for purchase at CCHS but have been issued in cases of emergency to ensure that students have access to food during the school day - with agreement from home to settle the cost. Dinner tickets are not issued for students in receipt of free school meals (FSM) since these funds (£3 per day) are always available. From Monday, 3<sup>rd</sup> March 2025 Dinner tickets will be replaced with **Meal Deal Tickets (MDT)** redeemable against a main meal only. MDTs will only be issued in the case of emergency and will not be issued to students with dinner money accounts in debt (minus amounts) or to students receiving free school meals. Parents will be contacted to ensure the cost can be returned to the school.

#### Important reminders

- Please ensure you top up dinner money in advance as balances can take some time to show on the catering till system.
- All students are expected to have a water bottle to top up from water stations at break and lunchtime

#### How to top up Arbor Pay (dinner money)

The payment/top-up option is available within the Arbor Portal and App. Once logged in, go to Accounts and click on top up balance. A "how to guide" is available on our <u>Website</u> or follow this link <u>Arbor Pay</u>.

#### Free School Meal Allowances (FSM)

FSM allowance of £3 per day will not show on Arbor Pay but will be credited to accounts via the catering till system. Please note that students can access these funds from break time and can be used partially, or fully, and balances are deleted at the end of the day. Dinner money balances can be topped up (as above) please ensure you do this in advance.

#### **Breakfast Club at CCHS**

Toast is available Monday to Friday from 08.15 - 08.45 for all students who may not have had breakfast; there is no charge for this. Please feel free to send your child if they need breakfast at the start of the day. No registration or booking is required. Breakfast is so important to give a child energy for the day to help them focus in their lessons. With this in mind please ensure your child has a healthy breakfast every morning.

#### Relationships, Sex and Health Education (RSHE) Essex Survey 2025

Essex County Council have contacted all schools in Essex about their Relationships, Sex and Health Education (RSHE) survey 2025 which is aimed at young people aged 11-25 to find out their views in relation to big topics such as relationships, sexual health and how young people use the internet. The information received from this survey will be used to shape a number of services for young people including education, professional training and sexual health services. Findings will also be shared with Essex Safeguarding Children Board (ESCB) to inform their wider work on keeping children and young people safe across the county.

The confidential survey is open to 11 (Year 7) to 25 year olds and is **optional for young people to complete.** The survey will close on Sunday 16<sup>th</sup> March. Findings of the survey will be shared with a range of stakeholders including educational settings and published around May. Findings will be available at county level and where we have enough responses also at district level.

To ensure that the views of as many young people in Essex are captured as possible, Essex County Council have shared the link to the survey: Relationships, Sex & Health Education Survey 2025 - Essex County Council - Citizen Space as well as a QR code to the survey which can be found on this poster.

This survey link and poster will also be posted on your child's Google Classroom for them to access from Monday 3rd March. When completing the survey, students will need to select the **Tendring district** as part of the process.

#### What is a Passport to Prom?

The Passport to Prom is an incentive for our Year 11 students to attend as many revision sessions as possible and maintain excellent school attendance in the final push towards their exams. It is an annual event for Year 11 students and this year our students have already made an excellent effort to attend the revision sessions offered.

#### What criteria do students need to meet?

In addition to behaving appropriately and attending all lessons, students need to opt in by: attending a minimum of five maths, five English and five science revision sessions; attending at least ten other subject sessions of their choice; achieving a 95% attendance record or higher from the start of January through to their exams and completing three quality pieces of homework per week. As an additional incentive, students who complete thirty-five revision sessions or more will be entered into a prize draw for some great Prom themed prizes.

Around 1.25 million people in the UK suffer from these illnesses, many in secret. They are of all ages, genders and backgrounds – eating disorders do not discriminate. Eating disorders include bulimia, binge eating disorder, avoidant/restrictive food intake disorder (ARFID), other specified feeding or eating disorder (OSFED), and anorexia, which tragically has the highest mortality rate of any mental illness, though all eating disorders can be deadly. While this is the worst-case scenario, there are many ways in which eating disorders severely affect the quality of life of both those suffering and those who care about them. They steal childhoods, devastate relationships and pull families apart. But, with the right treatment and support, recovery is possible.
