Free On-line Workshop

How to Support your Child around Exam Anxiety – Wednesday 23rd, April at 7pm.

NELFT MHST will be running an exam stress workshop for parents to equip them with strategies to support their child during exam periods.

About this event

We all experience stress from time to time, and this is normal. For young people, this feeling may be triggered when facing exams and could lead to uncomfortable physical sensations and unhelpful ways of thinking and behaving. We understand the impact this can have on young people and their families and how this may leave parents struggling to know what the best thing to say or do is. Because of this, the **NELFT Mental Health Support Team** will be running an exam stress workshop for parents to equip them with cognitive behavioural strategies to support their young people during exam periods. Run by experienced practitioners, this online free workshop will explore:

- The teenage brain
- What stress is
- When stress becomes a problem
- Techniques to manage physical symptoms
- Techniques to manage unhelpful ways of thinking
- Techniques to promote healthy patterns of behaviour
- Things that are within and out of our control
- How to make stress our friend

Has your child downloaded the Student Arbor App yet?



Dinner Money – Students can see their dinner money balance and let you know if they need a dinner money top up! (Free school meal allowances will not be visible)

Ask Arbor - Powered by AI. Students can ask Arbor questions about their day and get answers instantly. E.g. "Do I have PE tomorrow?" "How much lunch money do I have?"

If students need to check the App whilst at school they must ask a member of staff for permission to use their phone first.

Convenience - The Student Arbor App offers a convenient way for students to access their school information, without having to always rely on their parents and carers.

Progress and behaviour - The App provides access to the information they need to understand their own progress and performance. They can easily check their calendar, see their behaviour points, and exactly when and why they were awarded them.

Attendance - The App also gives students an overview of their attendance by day, week, or term.

Assignments - Students can see which assignments are coming up, or are overdue, all without needing to ask their parents/carers or teachers.

Security - The App is designed specifically for mobile phones, it's super intuitive to use, and it's secure, with biometric login, including Face ID.

In App Messages - Whether it's an exam room change or a non-uniform day, students will see in-app messages.

Relationships, Sex and Health Education (RSHE) Essex Survey 2025

Essex County Council have contacted all schools in Essex about their Relationships, Sex and Health Education (RSHE) survey 2025 which is aimed at young people aged 11-25 to find out their views in relation to big topics such as relationships, sexual health and how young people use the internet. The information received from this survey will be used to shape a number of services for young people including education, professional training and sexual health services. Findings will also be shared with Essex Safeguarding Children Board (ESCB) to inform their wider work on keeping children and young people safe across the county.

The confidential survey is open to 11 (Year 7) to 25 year olds and is **optional for young people to complete.** The survey will close on Sunday 16th March. Findings of the survey will be shared with a range of stakeholders including educational settings and published around May. Findings will be available at county level and where we have enough responses also at district level.

To ensure that the views of as many young people in Essex are captured as possible, Essex County Council have shared the link to the survey: Relationships, Sex & Health Education Survey 2025 - Essex County Council - Citizen Space as well as a QR code to the survey which can be found on this poster.

This survey link and poster will also be posted on your child's Google Classroom for them to access from Monday 3rd March. When completing the survey, students will need to select the **Tendring district** as part of the process.
