# **Whole School Notices**

## Important information for cashless catering

From Monday, 22<sup>nd</sup> April (after the Easter holidays) CCHS will move away from the biometric fingerprint recognition in Clouds restaurant. Fingerprint purchasing will be replaced with a cashless card. Each student will be issued a card linked to their Arbor account, they will be responsible for keeping the card safe and having it at hand should they wish to purchase refreshments at school. Cashless cards work like bank cards and students can tap and pay on the card readers in Clouds.

There will be no changes to Arbor dinner money accounts or current Free school meal allowances (FSM). Dinner money accounts can be topped up in advance, as usual, in the same way, and FSM allowances will also be accessible to spend using the cashless card.

Your child's card will be distributed during form time next week, each card has a unique number, specific to each student. Your child will be instructed to write their name on the card using a permanent marker pen so that it can be easily returned if lost.

Should your child forget/lose their card they will need to go to the student services desk (in Clouds) at break or lunch to be given their unique PIN to enter into the PIN pad at the till to make a purchase. Student services will also be able to inform students of dinner money account balances before approaching the tills with a purchase.

As with any new system or process, there may be some resistance and teething issues so we ask for support and understanding during the early stages of this change. Both cards or fingerprints can be used until Easter. Thank you.

# Arriving at school without an appointment

We appreciate that there are times when our parents and carers wish to see a member of staff without an appointment, unfortunately, this is rarely possible as our staff are committed to other responsibilities including timetabled teaching, scheduled meetings and pastoral-related matters. If you arrive at reception without a pre-arranged meeting you will be asked to complete a contact request form and the relevant/most appropriate member of staff will contact you as soon as possible.
