# Taking care of exam stress

It is healthy, and normal, to feel nervous about tests. However, if your child experiences overwhelming or debilitating levels of stress or anxiety before, during or after a test they may need some extra support. YOUNGMINDS has a specific section on Exam self-care, click here to read more.

#### **Planning: Revision for students**

- 1. **Start Early**: You may feel like you have a long time, but starting early gives you plenty of time to cover everything.
- 2. **Create a Revision Plan**: Organise your subjects and topics. Break everything into manageable chunks, and give yourself breaks so you don't burn out.
- 3. **Practice Past Papers**: They give you a good idea of what types of questions to expect and help you practice your timing.
- 4. **Use Active Revision**: Instead of just reading, try making flashcards, summarising notes, or teaching someone else what you've learned. The more active you are, the better you'll retain the info.
- 5. **Get Enough Sleep**: Rest is crucial for your brain to process and retain information.
- 6. Stay Positive: Stay calm, and remind yourself that you've got this. You've already put in the work!

#### For Parents and Carers – How can I help my child prepare for exam season?

#### 1. Create a Supportive Study Environment:

- Quiet, Organised Space: Provide a quiet and well-lit area free from distractions for studying. Ensure it's equipped with necessary study materials like books, stationary, and a computer.
- Routine: Encourage a structured study schedule to help students stay on track. Regular study times and breaks are essential for productivity.

#### 2. Encourage Time Management:

- Study Plan: Help your child create a revision timetable. Break down the curriculum into manageable chunks, and set realistic goals for each study session.
- Balance: Ensure a healthy balance between study and rest. Too much pressure can lead to burnout.

#### 3. Provide Emotional Support:

- Positive Reinforcement: Encourage them when they feel down and celebrate small achievements to build their confidence.
- Manage Stress: exams can be stressful, so it's important to talk openly about concerns. Practicing relaxation techniques, like deep breathing or short walks, can also help.

## 4. Help with Revision Techniques:

- **Active Revision**: Encourage methods like flashcards, mind maps, and quizzes to make revision more interactive. Testing themselves frequently helps with memory retention.
- **Past Papers**: Help them practice with past exam papers or sample questions to familiarise themselves with the exam format and time constraints.
- **Revision Guides**: Provide them with study guides or online resources that summarize key topics and explain concepts in a simpler way.

#### 5. Stay Involved with School Communication:

- **Teacher Updates**: Keep in touch with teachers to stay updated on their progress and any areas that need improvement.
- **School Resources**: Encourage participation in extra revision sessions or study groups offered by the school

#### **Essential exam equipment includes:**

- Black pen x2
- Pencil
- Ruler
- Rubber
- Highlighter pen for subjects such as English, history, geography, RE
- Scientific calculator for maths, science, and geography papers

If your child has trouble sourcing any of this equipment including a calculator, please let the school know as soon as possible so that one can be made available. A Scientific calculator is a vital piece of equipment for the maths and physics exams. If your child doesn't have one or forgets to bring one they should speak with their teacher.

#### **Revision sessions**

Morning pre-exam revision will either be held in the main hall or in year 11 tutor rooms, notices will alert students of the location on the day. Morning revision sessions start at 8.15 am. Students may enter through the main reception doors from 8.10 am.

## Up to and including Friday, 6th June

Students are expected to attend normal lessons if not in revision or an exam up to and including Friday, 6<sup>th</sup> June. If they have finished a subject (exam has been taken), they will need to bring in revision materials to revise independently for upcoming exams in the normal lesson time.

## From Monday, 9th June - Study Leave

Students are expected to be in school for pre-exam revision and exams only. This is known as Study Leave.

All students are expected to be in full uniform whilst on the school site.


## Holland Football Club Family Fun Day - Friday, 18th April
