Whole School Notices

Wishing all our CCHS and Sigma Sixth families a safe and sunny Easter break. We look forward to seeing everyone back on Tuesday, 22nd April.

Many of you will be aware of the extensive road closures and diversions due to gas pipe work in and around Clacton at the moment. Unfortunately, we have been informed that Cadent will commence work to replace gas pipework in the vicinity of the school between 7th April to 2nd June.

These works do not affect the school gas supply, but there will be roadworks and associated traffic control measures on various sections of road throughout this period around the entrance/exit to Clacton Leisure Centre, along Vista Road and a section of Walton Road up to Avondale Road. Affected areas are highlighted on the accompanying map.



These works may cause delays on the roads around the school during peak times and we advise that, after the Easter Break, you factor into your journeys, the potential of delays in the morning and afternoon, or arrange to pick students up from a different location away from the works taking place.

Please drive carefully, leaving extra time for the school run.

After the Easter break, Year 10 career interviews will begin to help students explore future career options based on their interests, skills, and qualifications. These interviews, supported by the Career Information and Guidance (CIAG) team, will assist them in deciding on the best pathway for their post-16 education or training.

To make the most of their session, please encourage students to prepare by considering the following five key steps, which will be discussed during the interview:

- 1. Interests and Strengths What subjects or activities do you enjoy and excel in?
- 2. **Career Aspirations** What jobs or industries interest you?
- 3. Qualifications and Skills What qualifications do you need for your chosen career?
- 4. **Post-16 Pathways** Do you want to pursue A-levels, vocational courses, an apprenticeship, or another route?
- 5. Action Plan What are your next steps to achieve your goals?

Taking time to reflect on these points will help ensure a productive and meaningful discussion about their future.

Students are expected to attend normal lessons if not in revision or an exam up to and including Friday, 6th June. If they have finished a subject (exam has been taken), they will need to bring in revision materials to revise independently for upcoming exams in the normal lesson time.

From Monday, 9th June - Study Leave

Students are expected to be in school for pre-exam revision and exams only. This is known as Study Leave.


